


Our new logo! Here is a description of what it represents by designer Sarah Orford



The inner aspect of the logo is comprised of five colourful points coming together. Individually they represent the five Mi'Kmaq communities in Cape Breton. The softened colours nod to the land - the earth, sea, sun, sky and trees. together, they form a geometric pattern found in Acadian and English rug hooking and textiles. As a whole, they form a star - an Acadian icon; flown on their flag.

The outer silhouette is derived from the provincial flower of Nova Scotia, the Mayflower. The shape is woven together - nodding to the cultural heritage of the Mi'Kmaq (woven baskets) and the Irish and Scottish (celtic knots). The infinite weave represents endlessness and unity - a way of tying together the past, present and future of the community.
